Course Description

An in depth study and performance of music written for an ensemble comprised of all saxophones

Objectives

- Rehearse and perform music for saxophone ensemble, that represents different musical stylistic periods.
- Identify and correct problems related to ensemble performance (e.g., intonation, balance, interpretation).
- Perform music learned during the semester, at the Woodwind Ensembles concert, as well as at other functions on and off campus.

Text and Materials

Repertoire selected for this class will be selected by the professor from music available in the University library, and from his own private collection. Students are expected to return all music at the end of the semester.

Academic Course Requirements

Attendance at rehearsals is mandatory. Students are responsible for learning the assigned music outside of class time. As this course is repeatable for credit, different repertoire is studied every semester.

Assessment

Students will be evaluated on their knowledge of their individual parts, as well as how well they perform with the other members of the ensemble. Attendance is extremely important, as it is impossible to conduct efficient rehearsals with absent or tardy students. See **Attendance Policy**
