## **Course Requirements**

- (2) Auralia an ear-training, cloud-based program that is integrated into Webcourses.

Due to classes being forced online this term, lab assignments and certain tests will need to be administered through Auralia. The purchase price is \$35 for a year subscription. (Most of you should already have access if you took MUT2126 last semester.)

If you don't already have access, you will be prompted to purchase a license when you first launch Auralia from within Webcourses to complete the first assignment. No serial numbers or registration codes are required. Your account will be created automatically and you will be emailed confirmation of your purchase. Please check your junk and spam folders if you can't find the email.

Note that all instructors and students must only use the program via Canvas (Webcourses). No additional login details are required or supported.

## **Course Description**

This course is intended to help you develop aural skills that relate to material encountered in Music Theory IV – the goal being the ability to hear meaningful patterns and musical relationships accurately and with understanding. The traditional skills of dictation and sight singing as well as other related activities will be covered.

<sup>\*</sup>This supplemental lab syllabus is to be used in conjunction with the lecture syllabus.

Individual progress in a skill-oriented course, such as this one, depends greatly on patience, practice, attendance, participation, and willingness to listen carefully to others and to oneself, so it is very important that we all **participate and support each other's efforts** during the class.

### **Tests**

During the semester there will be 6 tests (3 dictation tests and 3 individual singing tests) that will be common to all lab sections. Students will need to sign up for time slots for each of the individual singing tests during the weeks listed in the course schedule.

### Homework

There will be weekly assignments from Auralia. If you don't already have access, you will be prompted to purchase access when you first launch Auralia to complete the first assignment. You will have MANY listenings for each dictation and MANY attempts at each assignment. So, if you put the time in, regardless of your skill level, you should be able to earn strong grades for the assignments.

### **In-Class Work**

Many class meetings will include short practice dictations and singing exercises. Some of these in-class dictations may be informally assessed to measure progress.

# **In-Class Singing**

You might be called on individually to solfège and sing prepared melodies chosen from sections of the *Music for Sight Singing* assigned for the day. You should assume this could happen most class meetings, and there will always be the possibility of being called upon.

### **Late Work Policy**

Please make every effort to complete each assignment on time. Late assignments will generally not be accepted, except in cases involving emergencies or other unforeseen circumstances, at the discretion of the instructor. Students are given an entire week to complete each assignment, which should be more than enough time.

# **Attendance Policy**

The lab portion of the class will be synchronous and consistent attendance is expected. You will be expected to join the Zoom meeting for your lab each Tuesday and Thursday morning at your normally scheduled lab time. Students are allowed 3 unexcused absences throughout the semester. A student's final lab grade will drop 3 points for each unexcused absence beyond 3.

## **Makeup Test Policy**
